How do we work with oral history? Exchange of information

The Sigmund Freud University (AT) and Forum Institute (AT) search for ways to utilise collections of oral history stories in educational programs.

General objective of the project is to streamline stories from the past into educational programs with the aim of empowering people to look more critically at history and thus the current populist, aggressive political trends, which have been proven in the past to push societies into war and economic crisis. We aim to utilise discourses of traumatic past in education for avoiding conflicts in the future. Therefore, result of the project will be recommendations for educators for using stories recorded about past conflicts.

On March 23rd, 2023

in the premises of the **Sigmund Freud University in Vienna**

we are organising our first workshop aiming information exchange and ideation for the recommendations for educators.

After this workshop, experts of SFU and Forum Institute will process the gathered information and ideas and draft the recommendations. We will then test them with educators during a second workshop in Šamorín, Slovakia. The final version will be sent to all workshop participants and will be available on the project partners' websites.
